Just like people, pets may be affected by the Florida red tide. The following tips will help you minimize the impact of red tide on your pet:

- •If red tide is high in your area, consider bringing outdoor pets inside to prevent respiratory irritation. Depending on wind speed and direction, the toxins can travel at least 1 mile inland.
- •Do not allow your pet to play with or get ahold of dead sea life.
- •If your pet swims in water impacted by red tide, bathe it as soon as possible. Toxins can accumulate on the fur, and if a dog licks themselves after swimming they are liable to ingest the toxins.
- If your pet is acting ill (trouble breathing, coughing, eye irritation, etc.) after being in or near waters impacted by red tide, seek veterinary care immediately.
